Marian University grew out of the dedication and vision of Sister Theresa Hackelmeier and the Sisters of St. Francis, Oldenburg, Indiana, who established a school in Oldenburg, Indiana, in 1851. After a number of transformations, the school became Marian College in 1936. The college moved to Indianapolis in 1937 and classes began on September 15 in Allison Mansion.

On July 1, 2009, Marian College became Marian University. On May 4, 2011, Marian University received pre-accreditation status for a new medical school. On August 24, 2011, the university broke ground on the Michael A. Evans Center for Health Sciences that houses the Marian University College of Osteopathic Medicine and the Leighton School of Nursing. On August 6, 2013, Marian University held a ribbon-cutting ceremony and reception for the Michael A. Evans Center for Health Sciences. The College of Osteopathic Medicine matriculated its first class in August 2013.



The Most Reverend Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R. Doctor of Public Service

The Most Reverend Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R., was appointed Archbishop of Indianapolis by Pope Benedict XVI, on October 18, 2012. Before his appointment as Archbishop of Indianapolis, Archbishop Tobin served as the Archbishop Secretary of the Vatican Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life.

Archbishop Tobin, a Redemptorist priest, is a native of Detroit. He was born May 3, 1952, and is the oldest of 13 children. He was educated at Catholic schools. He studied at Holy Redeemer College in Waterford, Wisconsin, where he earned a bachelor's degree in philosophy in 1975. He also studied at Mount Saint Alphonsus Seminary in Esopus, New York, where he received a

master's degree in religious education in 1977 and a master of divinity degree in 1979. Archbishop Tobin speaks several languages including Spanish, Italian, French, and Portuguese.

Archbishop Tobin professed perpetual vows as a member of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (the Redemptorists) on August 21, 1976, and was ordained a priest on June 1, 1978. He was ordained an archbishop on October 9, 2010, in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome following his appointment on August 2, 2010, by Pope Benedict as the Archbishop Secretary of the Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life. In this role, Archbishop Tobin worked in the Vatican to oversee the more than one million men and women worldwide in religious orders.

Archbishop Tobin has served as a parish priest in the inner city in Detroit and Chicago. As associate pastor of Holy Redeemer Parish in Detroit from 1979 to 1984, Father Tobin was responsible for ministering to the Hispanic community. He served as pastor of Holy Redeemer Parish from 1984 to 1990. He then served as pastor of St. Alphonsus Parish in Chicago from July 1990 until October 1991.

Archbishop Tobin served as General Consultor of the Redemptorist congregation from 1991 to 1997 and as its Superior General from 1997 to 2009. He was appointed by the Pope to five Synods of Bishops in 1998, 1999, 2001, 2005, and 2008.

Archbishop Tobin has served as the co-chairman of the North American Orthodox-Catholic Theological Consultation since June 2013. He has also been a member of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Sub-Committee on the Church in Africa since June 2013. He is the chairmen-elect of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Committee on Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations and will become chairman following the USCCB's fall general assembly in 2016.

On March 29, 2014, Pope Francis appointed Archbishop Tobin a member of the Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life.

Marian University is honored to award an honorary doctorate to this humble servant of the Catholic Church who has employed his considerable gifts and talents to build up the Kingdom of God on earth and foster a paradigm of Christian charity and love in which all God's people may thrive.



Marni McKinney Waterfield

Doctor of Business Administration

Marni McKinney serves as president of the McKinney Family Foundation, a philanthropic organization which focuses its charitable efforts on supporting policies and practices that promote environmental responsibility to realize green, healthy, and sustainable communities. Past giving has included the creation of the McKinney Family Green Initiatives Fund to support the City of Indianapolis' Office of Sustainability, which focuses on environmental initiatives ranging from energy-efficient city buildings to bicycle paths.

Prior to leading the McKinney Family Foundation, McKinney served as chairman of Indiana Community Bank Board M & I Marshall & Isley Bank – Indiana Region, chairman of First Indiana Corporation and First Indiana Bank, N.A., and chief executive officer of the Somerset Group. Her professional memberships include the Young Presidents Organization, the American Bankers Organization, and the Chief Executives Organization.

Her effective leadership skills and contributions to the strength and stability of public corporations and financial institutions in Indiana have garnered her numerous awards including the Butler University Hilton U. Brown Achievement Award, the 1997 *Indianapolis Business Journal* Women of Influence Award, the *Indianapolis Business Journal* "Forty Under 40" Award, the Soroptimist International of Indianapolis Woman of Distinction Award, the YWCA Salute to Women of Achievement Award, and the Butler University "Fifty Under Fifty" Award.

McKinney is deeply invested in civic engagement and presently contributes her great acumen and experience to the Sierra Club Foundation Board of Directors as vice chairman, the Women's Fund of Central Indiana (Emeritus), the Butler University College of Business Administration Board of Visitors, the advisory panel of the Butler Business Consulting Group, and the Central Indiana Community Foundation Investment Committee. She has previously served on the board of directors of several organizations including the Indianapolis Art Center, Fairbanks Hospital, the Indiana Bond Bank, Indianapolis Economic Development, Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce, Indiana State Chamber of Commerce, the Children's Museum of Indianapolis, and Community Hospitals of Indiana, Inc., among others.

McKinney has a passionate interest in issues facing young women and girls in today's society, and through her own foundation, provides funding to organizations that support health, economic empowerment, and self-development initiatives for girls and young women in central Indiana.

McKinney earned her bachelor of science in economics degree from Butler University. She resides in Indianapolis. She is married to Richard D. Waterfield of Fort Wayne.

Michael and Rebecca Weaver

Doctors of Public Service

Michael and Rebecca Weaver serve as co-directors of the Weaver Popcorn Foundation, Inc., a charitable organization that gives central importance to improving educational opportunities at all levels for the youth of central Indiana. Mr. Weaver also serves as president and chief executive officer of Weaver Popcorn Company, which supplies approximately 30 percent of all popcorn consumed throughout the world, exporting to over 60 countries and producing 1.1 billion pouches of microwave popcorn. This is 50 percent of the microwave market in the United States.

The Weavers' commitment to addressing the needs of the community in central Indiana and beyond has afforded them the opportunity to advance the missions of Crossroads of America Council of the Boy Scouts of America, Second Helpings, Methodist Hospital Task Core, Garrett Theological Seminary, Knowledge is Power Program (KIPP) Charter School of Indianapolis, Carpe Diem Charter School, Tindley School, the Indiana State Fair, and Marian University, including the Academy for Teaching and Learning Leadership.

Mrs. Weaver grew up in Marion, Indiana, graduating from Mississinewa High School and attending Ball State University. Mr. Weaver grew up in Huntington, Indiana, graduating from Huntington High School where he lettered in basketball four years and was named as a member of the Indiana All Stars. He pursued an undergraduate degree from Northwestern University, where he was a three-year starter for the basketball team, and upon graduation with a bachelor of arts in economics in 1968, served in the United States Army for two years before earning his MBA in marketing in 1972. Mr. Weaver joined Weaver Popcorn Company in 1972 and became president in 1980. The company, now a fourth generation, family-owned business, was founded in 1928 by Ira Weaver, Mr. Weaver's grandfather and a United Brethren minister.

Together, the Weavers have three children and 10 wonderful grandchildren, ranging in age from two to 23. Mr. and Mrs. Weaver's twin grandsons currently attend Marian University.
