

Academic Regalia

The origin of academic regalia (gowns, hoods, and caps) dates back to the 12th century when universities began to form and most scholars belonged to religious orders. Colors became standardized in the United States in 1895 when a group of leading educators from Ivy League and New York universities (the Intercollegiate Commission) introduced an Academic Costume Code (i.e., colors identify the university and degree and the cut-and-style of the academic attire distinguishes the level of education).

Bachelor's gowns are simple with long, pointed sleeves and no trim. Master's gowns have oblong sleeves which are open at the wrist. Doctoral gowns are the most elaborate with front-facing velvet and three velvet bars on each billowing, bell-shaped sleeve.

Hoods

Bachelor regalia may include a hood which is 36 inches in length. Master's and doctoral regalia include hoods that are 42 and 48 inches in length, respectively. Hoods are

lined with silk that indicate the academic color(s) of the institution. A binding trim of velvet designates the subject in which the degree is granted. The color for doctoral degrees in medicine is green; the color was chosen to represent medieval herbs. Royal blue represents the doctoral degree in philosophy (Ph.D.).

Caps

Mortarboards are worn at all levels. Recently, tams have increasingly been adopted as the caps worn by doctoral candidates and those with a doctoral degree. Tassels are typically black or the color of the subject studied; gold tassels are worn by doctoral candidates and those with doctoral degrees. When candidates enter the ceremony, their tassels are on the right side of their cap. Graduation is signified symbolically when the tassel is moved to the left.

Dr. Yeleti has a bachelor of science degree from the University of Akron, Ohio, and a medical degree from Northeastern Ohio Universities College of Medicine. He served his internship and residency in internal medicine at the Mayo Graduate School of Medicine in Rochester, Minnesota, and served his fellowships in cardiovascular disease and interventional cardiology at Indiana University Medical Center and the Indiana Heart Institute.

Dr. Yeleti is board certified in internal medicine, cardiovascular disease, interventional cardiology and nuclear cardiology.

Alan E. Leighton '62 Sue E. Leighton (posthumous) Recipients of Doctor of Philanthropy

Alan E. Leighton '62 is a Marian University Board of Trustee member and former chief financial officer, treasurer, and secretary for Marian Incorporated, and 15 other related companies for the past 57 years. Alan has been involved with Marian University for most of his adult life. He's been co-chairman of the annual Marian University Alumni Fund Drive, and currently chairs the facilities committee, and the board's finance, executive, and investment committees.



Leighton's beloved wife of almost 52 years, Sue E. Leighton, who passed away in April 2020, was a longtime registered nurse who graduated from the Indiana University School of Nursing in 1964. Guided by her giving spirit, Sue spent many years volunteering at the Gennesaret Free Clinic in Indianapolis, she served 12 years on the Noblesville Public Library Board, and six years on the Hamilton County Red Cross Board. Sue was incredibly supportive of nursing education, as Marian University's Leighton School of Nursing is named after her and her husband Alan.

Alan Leighton continues to give back to the Indianapolis community by serving on past and present boards including the board of his alma mater, Cathedral High School, where he is a member of the foundation board. Past board service includes the Profit-Sharing 401K Council of America, (PSCA), the Indianapolis Rotary Club, as chair of the Rotary Foundation Investment Committee, and the Providence Cristo Rey High School work/study committee.

A member of the Holy Spirit at Geist Parish, Alan can be found singing tenor in the choir—a passion of his for the past 28 years. He has also been recognized as a James Whitcomb Riley fellow and by Marian University for his and his late wife's generous support.

Before her death, Sue and her husband Alan traveled extensively for 40 years and enjoyed spending time with family and friends. From their union, they have one son, Erik; a great daughter-in law, Mindy; and two grandchildren, Rachel and Ryan, whom Alan says definitely keep him young.

Marianne Glick Recipient of Doctor of Philanthropy

Marianne Glick serves as chairman of the board for the Eugene and Marilyn Glick Family Foundation and TeenWorks. She also serves on the board of directors for the Central Indiana Community Foundation, Gene Glick Company, the Glick Housing Foundation, Ascend, Goodwill Industries, Ivy Tech Community College, and United Way of Central Indiana (where she was campaign chair in 2011 and campaign co-chair in 2012). She previously served as a trustee for Ball State University for 10 years and was on the board of advisors for Butler University's Andre B. Lacy School of Business.

Glick received her Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education and Master of Science in Educational Psychology from Butler University. She was an early pioneer in cable TV and had a home

renovation business and her own training/consulting firm. After "retiring," she began painting and has become an accomplished artist, with paintings being accepted into juried competitions and winning awards in Indiana, Michigan, Illinois, and Florida. She often contributes her paintings to assist nonprofit organizations.



Glick has earned several awards for her philanthropic efforts in the community including: May Wright Sewell Award, 2019; Charles Whistler Award, 2018; Community Mentor of the Year from Big Brothers Big Sisters, 2016; Sagamore of the Wabash, 2014; The Michael Carroll Award, 2013; the first Honorary Alumni from Ball State University, 2013; Indianapolis Business Journal Woman of Influence Award, 2013; Spirit of Philanthropy Award from Indiana University, 2014; and the Touchstone Award from Girls Inc. in 2012.
