Transfer-In Instructions for F-1 Students

This document will explain how to transfer your SEVIS record to Marian University.

Should I transfer my SEVIS record?

If you are currently studying or recently finished your studies in the U.S., or are on Optional Practical Training (OPT), you must transfer your SEVIS record to Marian University before beginning your studies here. Once your SEVIS record is transferred, your OPT eligibility ends.

Who should not request a transfer of their SEVIS record?

In the following situations, a student must obtain a new I-20:

- If you completed your studies more than five months ago
- If you have a terminated or completed SEVIS record
- If you cannot start at Marian University in the next available semester. See below: "When must I start my studies at Marian University?"

How do I transfer my SEVIS record?

Complete Part A of this form. Ask the Designated School Official (DSO) at your current institution to complete Part B.

When can I get the Marian University I-20?

- If you will not leave the U.S. before stating at Marian University, you will receive your new I-20 upon arrival to campus.
- If you will leave the U.S. prior to beginning at Marian University, you must request the Marian University I-20 prior to leaving the U.S. Your I-20 will be sent to your U.S. address. If this is not possible, you must email rhinkle@marian.edu to formally request that your I-20 be sent abroad.

Do I need to change my visa?

If your current visa has not expired, a new visa is not required even if the visa carries the name of your previous institution. If your visa has expired, however, you must apply for a new visa using your Marian University I-20.

When must I start my program at Marian University?

You must start your studies within five months of the last day you attended classes at your previous institution or the next available term, **whichever comes sooner**.
