Not every student wants or needs the same things in a place to live. That's why Marian University has a range of on-campus housing options that provide students with the living environments they're looking for.

Many first-year students are housed at **Doyle Hall**—a place we created to help our newest students make the transition between home and college and get acquainted with the campus community. The central lobby is a gathering place for both social and academic activities; in fact, everything about Doyle Hall encourages community and relationship building. It's a wonderful place to meet new friends and explore everything Marian University has to offer.

Upper-level students have several housing options. **Clare Hall** features double suite-style rooms on the second floor and traditional community-style doubles on the third floor. It houses the Barbara B. Cooling Dining Center and many administrative offices.

University Hall is our newest campus addition. Opened in the fall of 2008, it provides suite-style rooms and large updated common areas for student gathering. Kitchenettes are available on each floor and the outdoor patio is a great environment in the warmer months.

Looking for a little more freedom? Marian University also offers **on-campus apartments and houses** for students 21 and older. Apartments include two bedrooms and two bathrooms, with laundry facilities and utilities included. Specific house amenities vary by location, but all include laundry facilities and basic utilities.
