ERIC (Educational Resource Information Center) via EBSCO Host

ERIC (Educational Resource Information Center) provides articles from journals included in the *Current Index of Journals in Education* and *Resources in Education Index*. There are more than 1.2 million journal articles and other **education-related** materials included in ERIC. Links are provided to more than 224,000 full-text documents.

Accessing ERIC

Access to ERIC is available to all Marian University students, faculty and staff via a link from the library web site (www.marian.edu/library). Use the computers in the library, campus computer labs, or any computer with internet access.

Note about off campus access: You will be prompted to type in your Marian University email account name and password to authenticate you as a valid user before you will be able to access the database.

Path to database

Library web site → Articles and Databases → ERIC

Keep it simple

Search by one or two terms only.

Start with the most obvious or relevant term(s), narrow the search as you review your results.

Be certain you are spelling your search term(s) correctly.

Search operators (also called Boolean operators)

And	Or	Not
Decreases number of hits	Increases number of hits	Decreases number of hits
Each result contains all search terms.	Each result contains at least one search term.	Results do not contain the specified terms.
The search <i>heart and lung</i> finds items that contain both <i>heart and lung</i> .	The search <i>heart or lung</i> finds items that contain either <i>heart or</i> items that contain <i>lung</i> .	The search <i>heart not lung</i> finds items that contain <i>heart</i> but do not contain <i>lung</i> .

Grouping search terms and operators

Group similar terms, using parentheses and search operators to broaden the search.

(athletes or athletics or sports) and nutrition

Truncation and Wildcards

Truncation is represented by an asterisk (*). The * symbol may be used to search for any form of a root word. Educat* searches for educate, education, educational, educator, etc.

Truncation tip: Use “or” to search singular and plural forms of a root word instead of using *
Ex. (cell or cells) will search only for the singular and plural of “cell”
cell* will also return cellular, cellulose, celluloid or other non-relevant terms

The **wildcard** is represented by a question mark ?. To use the wildcard, enter your search terms and replace each unknown character with a ?. Results include all citations of that word with the ? replaced by a letter.
Example: type ne?t to find all citations containing neat, nest or next. Net is not returned because the wildcard replaces a single character.



Search results and printing

Sample search: ADHD

Sample hit result:

Click on either the title or  HTML Full Text  PDF Full Text to access the available text. If no link is specified, full-text is not available. The citation will be displayed first along with the abstract, followed by the full text of the article when available. **Note: Any item not accessible in full text format may be available via Interlibrary loan. Please complete the Interlibrary Loan Request form available on the library website and submit it to the circulation desk.**

Scan the abstract and article text **before** printing to be certain it is relevant and applicable to your needs. To print an article, display the text, click on the print button within the database (not the browser print icon) and follow the printing instructions.
