Project MUSE

Project MUSE is a collaborative project providing full text electronic access to a variety of scholarly journals in the areas of **arts, humanities and social sciences**. Over 400 journals, published by not-for-profit entities, are currently participating in Project Muse, providing content specifically geared toward the support of liberal arts education. All article content is included – text, graphics, charts and images – in HTML and PDF format.

Marian College subscribes to the **Project MUSE Standard Collection**, which provides 24/7 access to the full text content of nearly 300 scholarly journals. Users may browse by title or subject, or use more advanced search strategies to limit searches to subject areas or time of publication.

Access is available to all Marian University students, faculty and staff via a link from the library web site (www.marian.edu/library). Use the computers in the library, campus computer labs, or any computer with internet access.
