# What is the number one skill most important to employers? **Verbal communication.**

In its Job Outlook 2016 annual report, the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) surveyed more than 200 large national employers, like IBM and Chevron. Here is what they found.

## **TOP 10 SKILLS/QUALITIES IMPORTANT FOR JOB CANDIDATES:**

- 1. Ability to verbally communicate with persons inside and outside the organization
- 2. Ability to work in a team structure
- 3. Ability to make decisions and solve problems
- 4. Ability to plan, organize, and prioritize work
- 5. Ability to obtain and process information
- 6. Ability to analyze quantitative data
- 7. Technical knowledge related to the job
- 8. Proficiency with computer software programs
- 9. Ability to create and/or edit written reports
- 10. Ability to sell or influence others
