Marian University grew out of the dedication and vision of Sister Theresa Hackelmeier and the Sisters of St. Francis, Oldenburg, who established a school in Oldenburg, Indiana, in 1851. After a number of transformations the school became Marian College in 1936. The college moved to Indianapolis in 1937 and classes began on September 15 in Allison Mansion.

On July 1, 2009, Marian College became Marian University. On May 4, 2011, Marian University received pre-accreditation status for a new medical school. On August 24, 2011, Marian University broke ground for the Michael A. Evans Center for Health Sciences that will house the College of Osteopathic Medicine and the School of Nursing. The College of Osteopathic Medicine is scheduled to matriculate its first class in August 2013.

Honorary Degrees

Congresswoman Susan W. Brooks

Recipient of Doctor of Public Service

Congresswoman Susan W. Brooks represents the 5th Congressional District of Indiana, which spans eight diverse counties throughout the central part of the Hoosier state. As a new member of Congress, she currently serves on the Education and Workforce, Homeland Security, and Ethics Committees. She is also the Chairwoman of the Emergency Preparedness, Response, and Communications Subcommittee. Her strong background in both the public and private sectors includes experience as a proven difference-maker in areas such as public safety, homeland security, counter-terrorism, and economic development.

Before joining the House of Representatives, Congresswoman Brooks served as senior vice president and general counsel for Ivy Tech Community College. Collaborating with a wide network of stakeholders, she implemented workforce development strategies aiming to enhance job training and placement for thousands of Indiana residents. As a workforce development leader in Indiana, she served on the State Workforce Innovation Council, the BioCrossroadsLINX Board, the TechPoint Board, the Indiana Chamber of Commerce Ready Indiana Board, and the Indiana University Public Policy Institute Board of Visitors.

In 2001, President George W. Bush appointed Congresswoman Brooks as United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana. Serving as the chief federal law enforcement officer for a majority of the Hoosier state, she received bi-partisan acclaim for efforts to battle mortgage fraud, gun violence, drug trafficking, gangs, child exploitation, and identity theft.

Congresswoman Brooks also earned recognition as deputy mayor of Indianapolis during the Steve Goldsmith administration, where she provided oversight on public safety operations and drove community dialogue on vital civic issues. Over her tenure, she managed police, fire and emergency response efforts while serving on boards related to criminal justice, community corrections, violence reduction, and race relations.

After receiving her undergraduate degree from Miami University of Ohio, Congresswoman Brooks pursued a juris doctorate degree (J.D.) from the Indiana University Robert H. McKinney School of Law. She practiced law at the Indianapolis firm of Ice Miller and also served as a criminal defense attorney for Indianapolis based McClure, McClure, and Kammen.

Susan has devoted countless volunteer hours to numerous civic and community efforts to improve the lives of Hoosier children and families, including service on the following boards: St. Vincent Hospital, the Children's Museum, Women's Fund of Central Indiana, Indiana Youth Institute, Indiana University Robert H. McKinney School of Law Board of Visitors, Indianapolis Neighborhood Housing Partnership, Junior League of Indianapolis, and Carmel Library Foundation. She co-chaired the NCAA 2011 Women's Final Four.

Throughout her career, Congresswoman Brooks has received many awards for her accomplishments, including Who's Who in Law in 2002 and 2011, Influential Woman of Indianapolis in 2008 and 1999, the Touchstone Award from Girls Incorporated of Indianapolis in 2008, Sagamore of the Wabash in 2007, Indiana Lawyer Leadership in Law in 2006, the 40 Under 40 List, Super Lawyer in 2004-2008, the Child Award from the Children's Bureau, Inc., and the Education Award from the YMCA.

She resides in Carmel, Indiana with her husband David and two children.

Samuel L. Odle

Recipient of Doctor of Humanities

Samuel L. Odle is a senior policy adviser for Bose Public Affairs Group. In this capacity, Odle works with clients on a variety of public policy issues involving health care and the life sciences.

Prior to joining Bose Public Affairs Group, Odle served as the chief operating officer of Indianapolis-based Indiana University Health and held the position of chief executive officer of both Methodist Hospital and University Hospital. He retired in July 2012 after a career that started as vice president of operations at Methodist Hospital in 1981.

Odle is a newly elected member of the Indianapolis Public Schools School Board. In addition, Odle is board-certified in health care management, and a fellow and past chairman of the American College of Healthcare Executives. He works with the Robert Wood Johnson Executive Nurse Fellowship program to develop future health care leaders, and is also a member of FACHE (Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives).

Active in the community, Odle has served on the board of directors for the Crossroads of America Council of the Boy Scouts of America since 2001, including a term as president where he launched a \$16 million major gifts campaign to help fund scouting programs and resources to boys throughout the state. In 2008, Odle served as chairman of the United Way fundraising campaign, which raised nearly \$39 million.

Odle has been recognized on several occasions for both his professional and community service. In 2011, Odle received the Greater Indianapolis Progress Committee "Charles L. Whistler Award" for his visionary and enthusiastic leadership in serving the community in addition to his success in bringing together the public and private sectors for civic improvement in Indianapolis. In 2007, he was inducted into the Indiana Business Hall of Fame.

Marian University is honored to recognize a man who has employed his many gifts and talents to promote and sustain the economic stability, physical well-being, and educational improvement of Hoosiers throughout Indiana.

Jefferson W. Brougher

Recipient of Doctor of Business Administration

Born in 1933, Jefferson W. Brougher is the oldest of six children born to Warren and Marybelle Brougher. He grew up in Columbus, Indiana, and graduated from Columbus High School in 1951. After one semester at Franklin College, Brougher answered his country's call and joined the United States Air Force. He served for four years during the Korean War. He returned to Indiana after his service and settled with his new wife, Erlene Brougher, in Evansville.

Brougher started Brougher Agency in 1956 in Evansville, and specialized in life insurance, earning a living as a commissioned salesman. In 1966, Brougher moved the business, and his family to Indianapolis, where it continued to grow and prosper.

In 1976, after the passage of the Employment Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA), Brougher set out to expand his insurance offering to include group medical insurance. With employers beginning to wrestle with the high cost of medical insurance for their employees, Brougher recognized that self-insurance would help curb medical insurance costs, and he pioneered Stop Loss Insurance as a way to facilitate self-insurance for employers of all sizes. Today, more than half of all employers in the United States purchase Stop Loss Insurance for their self-insured employee benefit plans.

Brougher moved his family and business to Greenwood, Indiana, and Brougher Agency evolved into an international insurance organization with offices throughout the United States and abroad. His first renovation project was the Greenwood Bowling Alley, which he converted to office space for his company. In 1988, Brougher purchased the dilapidated Harry E. Wood High School in downtown Indianapolis, and converted it to class A office space. Later, in 1997, he purchased Clemens Vonnegut Public School 9, also in downtown Indianapolis and converted it to office space.

In 1989, Brougher sold Brougher Insurance Group. Not ready to retire, he started International Medical Group (IMG) with the goal of providing medical insurance to non-United States citizens in the United States, and United States citizens while not in the United States. IMG is now recognized as the leading provider of worldwide medical insurance for individuals and groups. He remained as chairman of the board of IMG until its sale in 2012.

Brougher has served on the Board of Trustees of Marian College, Visiting Nurses Service, and St. Francis Hospital Foundation. He has four children and seven grandchildren. He remained married to Erlene Brougher until her death in 2008.

Marian University is honored to recognize a man who has dedicated his life to ensuring economic stability for individuals throughout the world and economic vitality for the communities in which his efforts are based.
