After a number of transformations, the school became Marian College in 1936. The college moved to Indianapolis in 1937 and classes began on September 15 in Allison Mansion. On July 1, 2009, Marian College became Marian University.

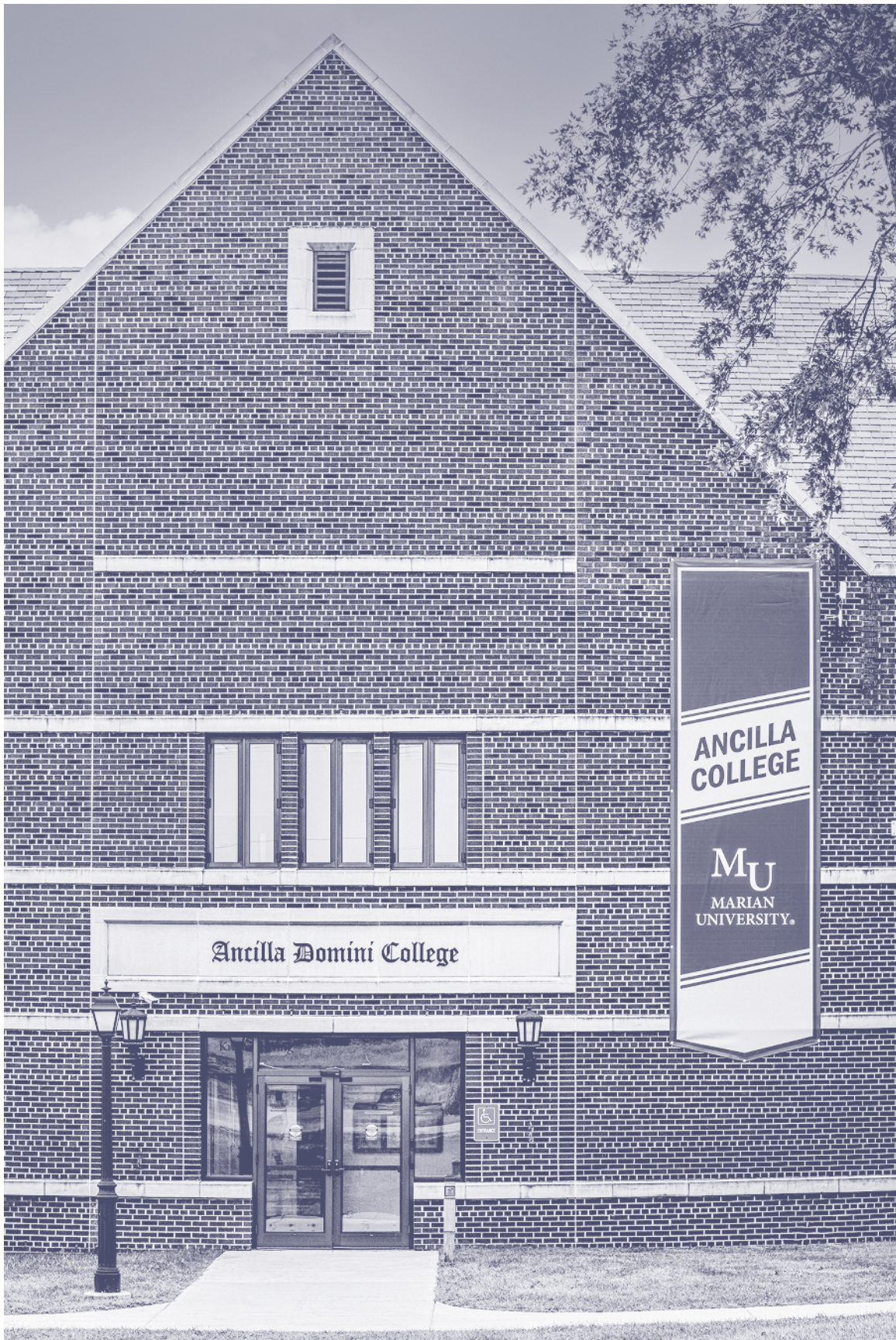

Gary L. Neidig is the president and chief executive officer of Indiana Technology and Manufacturing Companies (ITAMCO), a multi-faceted, advanced manufacturing company with its core business in metal machining of precision gears and machined components. During his career, he has helped develop ITAMCO from a small 24,000-square-foot facility to a totally integrated manufacturer with over 500,000 square feet.

Neidig graduated from Bob Jones University with a Bachelor of Science in Business Management and a minor in computer science. He is an active coder and has written engineering, as well as business system applications. During his 42 years in manufacturing, Neidig has served roles in customer service, engineering, and executive management, while overseeing technology development for advanced manufacturing.
