Inclusive Pedagogy Updates!

Thanks to everyone who attended the Tools for Teaching Conference! It was great to see the level of engagement from all 114 participants who attended. A link to the conference slides and resources will be available soon. A survey of the participants at the conference on August 20th found that 90% believed coaching faculty on the use of inclusive teaching strategies was extremely important or very important to the success of Marian and an overwhelming 97% felt providing faculty and staff training on cultural competency was extremely important or very important to the success of Marian.



The conference, which focused on inclusive teaching practices and understanding how identity plays a critical role in the classroom, is just the beginning of the professional development planned in this area. Please mark your calendars for the "Say What?!" Presentation on Tuesday, September 24th at 3 pm and the "Tunnel of Oppression" on November 15th and 16th with tours on the hour. Also, mark you calendars for <u>chapter discussions for bell hooks' book Teaching to Transgress – Education as the Practice of Freedom</u> on Tuesday, October 1st and going through April 28, 2020.

Panopto Online Video Training



Panopto trainers are coming to campus! Panopto is a great tool to use for classroom use. With Panopto, you've got a single tool for video management, recording, live streaming, inside-video search, quizzing, analytics, mobile, and more. It's also integrated into our instance of Canvas! If you'd like to learn more about how to use Panopto, we have two trainings coming up on Wednesday, 9/25. Come to one or both sessions! Be sure to bring a laptop with you so you can follow along.

<u>Panopto: Beginner Creator</u> - Panopto/Canvas Integration, Viewer features, Basics of Recording, Editing (include captions), and Sharing

<u>Panopto: Advanced Creator</u> – Panopto/Canvas Integration, Video/Folder Settings, Advanced Recording (multi-stream recording, distributed recording, webcasts), Advanced Editing (Adding additional content, splicing, Adding Streams, all about Captions), and Mobile apps (iOS/Android)

Institutional Learning Outcomes: Track Your Students' Progress in Canvas

Canvas allows instructors to track student progress and mastery of institutional learning outcomes. The first step is identifying the specific institutional learning outcomes and criteria addressed in your course and setting up rubrics. A video tutorial available at https://libguides.marian.edu/assessmentresources/outcomesandrubrics will help instructors identify specific institutional learning outcomes and criteria addressed in their course and use those as they assess student assignments. Scholarship of Teaching and Learning Session

Have you tried something new in your classroom? Wondering how best to examine if it improved student learning? On Tuesday, September 10th from 3:30-4:30pm in NC102, Kristy Wilson, PhD, Assistant Professor of Biology, will present on the scholarship of teaching and learning (SoTL). This session serves as a general introduction to SoTL showing how it can help support excellence in teaching and be a way for faculty to do scholarship/research. This session will discuss how SoTL has administrative support and can play an important role in faculty promotion and tenure. Kristy will also discuss her role as the Faculty Lead for SoTL and coaching available for faculty, staff, and

Podcast: How to Get Students to Participate in Discussion



The Teaching in Higher Ed podcast is the space where we explore the art and science of being more effective at facilitating learning. No one answers. How do we approach discussions differently? Since beginning his teaching career in 1970, Stephen Brookfield has worked in England, Canada, Australia, and the United States, teaching in a variety of college settings. He
