

Marian University International Travel Grants

Eligibility

1. Student must be in good academic standing with no probations or account holds.
2. Student must be enrolled in a credit-bearing course.
3. Student must have demonstrated financial need as determined by the Office of Financial Aid and the Global Engagement Office (GEO).
4. Student must complete the Marian University International Travel Grant application by the specified deadline. This application requires students to identify the intended study abroad program.

Selection

1. Awardees will be notified via their University email address.
2. Awards will be based on financial need, quality of application responses, rationale for participation in a particular study abroad program, program duration, overall program cost, and the availability of funds.

Travel Grants

Not all applicants with need will receive the exact amount below as they are estimated grants only, as the awards depend on the criteria noted above.

- 2 weeks: \$500
- 3 weeks: \$750
- 4 weeks: \$1,250
- 5 weeks: \$1,500
- 6 weeks: \$1,750
- 8 weeks: \$2,000
- 14-18 weeks: \$2,500- \$7,500

Post-Program Obligations

1. Awardees must submit a program evaluation through Study Abroad's Canvas site.
2. Awardees must write a reflection or thank you letter, including an overview of what he/she/they experienced and any personal as well as cultural realizations.

*A study abroad program is defined as an approved academic program outside the U.S. that is at minimum two weeks long.

*All documentation required by Study Abroad must be submitted before the grant is disbursed.

*Grants are dispersed at the beginning of each term.
