ACADEMIC ADVISING AND REGISTERING FOR CLASSES

- All second degree online nursing students will register through their CAMS student portal. Site directors and nursing advisors are available to answer questions specifically about the nursing curriculum. **For assistance with online registration, please see the information provided on our [Registration Resources](#) page.**
- Students who have an outstanding balance at the time of registration will not be able to register until all financial holds have been cleared with the Business Office.
- **NO LATE REGISTRATION:** Students **must** be registered in their CAMS Student Portal by Sunday, January 13th @ 11:59pm or they will **not** be able to start classes for the spring semester. CAMS Student Portal will be available for online registration through Sunday, January 13th @ 11:59pm. Students who are not registered before this time will fall out of progression.

CLASS CANCELLATION OR CHANGE

The university reserves the right to change or cancel courses as needs and enrollment warrant. Because course information may change in between registration and the first day of classes, students should print an updated schedule from their CAMS student portal immediately prior to the start of the classes.

SCHEDULES FOR WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY and REDUCTION OF CHARGES:

A student who withdraws from school may be entitled to full or partial reduction of charges. Reduction of charges is based on the official date of withdrawal as recorded in the Office of the Registrar. Consult with the Financial Aid Office concerning the impact that withdrawal may have upon current financial aid awards.

Standard (semester-long) courses

- withdraw during calendar week 1 = 100%
- Withdraw during calendar week 2 = 90%
- Withdraw during calendar week 3 = 60%
- Withdraw during calendar week 4 = 25%
- Withdraw during calendar week 5 or after = 0%

Courses lasting 5 weeks or more

(up to, but not including, semester-long courses)

- withdraw during calendar week 1 = 100%
- withdraw during calendar week 2 = 50%
- withdraw during calendar week 3 or after = 0%
- *last date to withdraw with "W" grade – 5 business days before the end date of class*

Courses lasting 4 or fewer weeks – no "W" grades given without complete withdrawal from the university

- withdraw prior to start of class = 100%; withdraw after class begins = 0% - *last date to withdraw with "W" grade –5 business days before published end date of the class. If class meets less than 5 days, withdraw is not permitted after class begins.*

If you discontinue a class without following proper withdrawal procedures, you will receive a failing grade. To withdraw from an individual class, contact your advisor or Director of Nursing Education; a \$50 change in registration fee will be assessed. To withdraw from all classes for the semester (withdraw from the university), contact the Office of the Registrar.

All student academic information is considered confidential except the following "directory" information available to the public: student's name, campus address, off-campus address, email address, telephone number, date of birth, photograph, major field of study, participation in university activities and sports, physical and performance statistics of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, enrollment status, degrees, awards, and honors including the Dean's List, and most recent previous institution attended by student. **The student may request that "directory" information not be released by completing the FERPA Request form in the Office of the Registrar at the beginning of each semester. Failure to notify the Office of the Registrar may mean that university publications, such as team rosters or student directories, may include some directory information.
