The master's degree in counseling prepares mental health professionals who help children, teens, adults, and families manage and overcome challenges.

With an innovative, competency-based curriculum rooted in the scientist-practitioner training model, we take a holistic approach to mental health that integrates mind, body, and spirit. When you complete this degree, you'll have the tools needed to conduct evidence-based individual and group psychotherapy.

Depending on your goals and desired practice settings, we offer two tracks:

- Clinical mental health counseling
- School counseling

Whether you complete one or both tracks, you'll experience a curriculum that builds your competency in core concepts identified by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling & Related Educational Programs (CACREP) and the Master's in Psychology and Counseling Accreditation Council (MPCAC):



- 1. Professional counseling orientation and
- ethical practice
- 2. Social and cultural diversity
- 3. Human growth and development
- 4. Career development
- 5. Counseling and helping relationships
- 6. Group counseling and promoting social skills
- 7. Assessment and testing
- 8. Research and program evaluation

Both tracks are two-year, full-time programs delivered on campus. Part-time students may be considered in some circumstances.

Clinical Mental Health Counseling

Marian University's clinical mental health counseling degree is designed for students who want a broader curriculum in applied psychology with a goal of conducting evidence-based assessment and treatment of people with mental health concerns.

Courses in this 60-credit program will give you the knowledge and tools to conduct clinical interventions with diverse groups of clients of all ages. You will explore methods, techniques, and best practices for helping clients. In addition, you'll complete 1,000 hours of supervised practicum and internship experiences.

Upon graduation and completion of the staterequired 3,000 hours of post-graduate clinical experience, you'll be ready to apply for Licensed Mental Health Counselor (LMHC) credentials in Indiana. As a LMHC, you can:

- Practice in a range of settings and seek employment with nonprofit organizations, social service agencies, hospitals, inpatient and outpatient facilities, community clinics, and private practices.
- Assess and diagnose clients with a wide range of mental health concerns.

- Implement evidence-based treatments to guide clients to improved psychosocial wellness.
- Know when and how to help clients obtain resources and services for improved quality of life, identify signs of abuse, and recognize those at risk for harming themselves or others.
- Establish a professional identity as a master'slevel scientist-practitioner.

Admission Requirements

No matter which counseling track you might choose, our admission requirements include:

- Bachelor's degree from regionally accredited institution
- Undergraduate GPA of at least 3.00
- Graduate Record Examination (GRE) score of 150 verbal, 145 quantitative, and a four or higher in analytical writing preferred
- Completion of undergraduate courses in lifespan development, abnormal psychology and statistics or research methods

School Counseling

Licensed school counselors work with children and teens in public and private K-12 school settings. They help elementary and secondary students build required skills for academic and social success.

School counselors meet with students individually for one-on-one sessions. They lead group sessions for students experiencing similar challenges or barriers to success. They also create and deliver special programs or curriculum about topics that can impact all youth, like abuse, divorce, bullying, drugs and alcohol, suicide, and family issues.

Our 48-credit curriculum includes a range of required courses on relevant topics identified in the CACREP core competencies. It also includes 700 hours of supervised practicum/internship experience. Upon graduation, you will be prepared to:

- Pursue initial K-12 school counseling licensure through the Indiana Department of Education.
- Successfully complete Indiana's CORE Assessments for Educators.
- Apply Indiana's Rules for Educator Preparation and Accountability (REPA) standards.

For students who want to complete the clinical mental health counseling track in addition to the school counseling track, an additional 15 hours of coursework is required.
