Description:

This table provides a matrix of current employment categories (as of April 2022) for graduates of the Master of Arts in Educational Leadership (MAEL) advanced program.

Analysis:

- The number of students enrolling in the MAEL program has decreased over the last three cycles.
- Nearly all program graduates in the last three cohorts have retained employment in the K-12 educational sector.
- 11 of 17 graduates from cohorts 8 and 9 are currently serving in an administrative or other supervisory/coaching role.

Interpretation:

The retention of graduates in the educational sector indicates that the advanced program is helping educators develop leadership skills and the motivation necessary to remain in K-12 education despite the many challenges posed by COVID-19 and other factors. A majority of graduates who completed more than a year ago (cohorts 8 & 9) have moved into the roles of school administrator, dean, or instructional coach – roles in which they must exercise leadership.
