## **IDOE** Completer Satisfaction Survey 3-Year Analysis 2021-2024

## **Description:**

Each year, the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE) surveys completers to determine their satisfaction with the preparation received from their EPPs. This survey is administered with no interaction from the EPPs. It includes 22 questions covering three main areas of teacher preparation (knowledge, pedagogy, and professional disposition) and one question simply asking completers for general satisfaction with the preparation provided by the EPP. In addition, the table includes the total percentage of "Agree" and "Strongly Agree" in response to each statement, for both the EPP and State.

## Analysis:

- On average, Marian alumni reported higher satisfaction ratings in 15 out of 22 areas compared to the 3-year state average.
- On average, Marian alumni reported a satisfaction rating of 98.6% or higher in seven areas, including: understanding how learners learn and grow, adhering to ethical requirements, adhering to legal requirements, providing an inclusive environment, exhibiting ethical practice, working effectively with other professionals, and working effectively within a school culture.
- The Marian alumni noted the two lowest satisfaction ratings of 88.7% in providing a rigorous learning environment and 85.9% in the overall assessment of how well they felt prepared to teach by the university.
- In 2023-2024, alumni rated the overall assessment of their preparation slightly higher (87.2%) than 83.3% in 2021-2022.

• Alumni satisfaction with developing quality assessments to test students' understanding of lessons increased significantly from 87.5% in 2021-22 to 100% in 2023-2024.

## Interpretation:

Marian alumni report higher satisfaction in 15 out of 22 areas compared to the state average over three years, indicating a generally strong and effective program. This suggests that Marian is doing well in preparing its graduates in many key aspects of teaching. There was a notable increase (from 87.5% to 100%) in satisfaction with developing quality assessments. This reflects a positive impact of previous curriculum changes in this critical area.

Completers consistently reported feeling well prepared for most of the teacher competencies, which suggests the program effectively prepares teachers for the field. However, the lower satisfaction with overall preparation is inconsistent with the higher rating on individual competencies. While there was a slight increase in the alumni's overall rating from the 2021-2022 school year to the 2023-2024 school year, more investigation is needed.

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
