

<i>Chasmantium latifolium</i>	Northern Sea Oats	mesic	partial sun to shade	Jul-Aug	Green*	2-3ft	Low	Seeds are used by wildlife
<i>Deschampsia cespitosa</i>	Tufted Hairgrass	mesic to wet-mesic	sun to partial sun	Jun	Silvery-white	1-3ft	Moderate	Semi-evergreen
<i>Elymus villosus</i>	Silky Wild Rye	mesic	shade	June	Green*	1-2ft	Low	Soft-foliage

<i>Betula nigra</i>	River Birch	mesic to wet-mesic	sun to partial sun	April-May	Tan*	50-90ft	Moderate	Good for many bird species
<i>Cercis canadensis</i>	Eastern Red Bud	dry-mesic to wet-mesic	sun to partial sun	April-May	Pink	12-30ft	High	
<i>Cornus florida</i>	Flowering Dogwood	dry to mesic	sun to partial sun	April-May	White	10-30ft	High	Good for many bird species
<i>Corylus americana</i>	American Hazelnut	wet-mesic to dry-mesic	sun to partial sun	April-May	Tan*	4-15ft	High	Great for wildlife
<i>Lindera benzoin</i>	Spicebush	wet-mesic to mesic	partial shade to shade	Mar-May	Yellow*	3-10ft	High	Aromatic leaves and twigs
<i>Liriodendron tulipifera</i>	Tulip Tree	mesic to dry-mesic	sun to partial sun	May-Jun	White and Orange	80-120ft	Moderate	Indiana's state tree
<i>Physocarpus opulifolius</i>	Ninebark	wet-mesic to dry-mesic	sun to partial sun	May-Jun	White	3-9ft	Moderate	
<i>Quercus rubra</i>	Northern Red Oak	dry to mesic	sun to partial sun	April-May	Yellow-Tan*	60-100ft	High	Excellent for wildlife
