

Suzanne LightCommencement Speaker
Doctor of Public Service



Suzanne M. Light, a visionary leader and dedicated community advocate, is the chief executive officer of Suzanne Light Consulting L.L.C., leveraging her experience to guide and empower organizations. Before this, Light served with remarkable distinction as the chief executive officer of the Kosciusko County Community Foundation, where her strategic leadership propelled the foundation's assets from \$400,000 to an impressive \$56 million, leaving an enduring influence on the region's philanthropic landscape.

Light's commitment to higher education is evident through her service on the Board of Trustees of Ancilla College from 2008 to 2016 and her engagement on the boards of Indiana Humanities, OrthoWorx, and the Orthopedic Capital Foundation.

Civic engagement and public service have been consistently important throughout Light's career. She was honored as Woman of the Year by the Kosciusko Chamber of Commerce in 2000, received the prestigious Sagamore of the Wabash award from Governor Eric Holcomb in 2018, and was recognized as the 2024 Community Catalyst Award recipient by the Kosciusko Economic Development Corporation.

Her academic achievements exemplify Light's dedication to lifelong learning. She earned a Bachelor of Science in Organizational Leadership from Goshen College in 2013 and a Master of Science in Leadership with a Nonprofit Leadership concentration from Trine University in 2016.

Today, Suzanne celebrates receiving an honorary degree from Marian University's Ancilla College alongside her husband of 50 years, Steve, their children, Kara and Matthew, and several of her sisters.

Tony RossDoctor of Communication



Anthony Martin Ross, affectionately known as "Tony The Boss Ross," served as an esteemed on-air personality and sports director for Kankakee Valley Broadcasting, WKVI K99.3 FM/MAX98.3 FM, serving the communities of Knox and Plymouth, Indiana.

A proud alumnus of Ancilla College, Tony held a deep and abiding connection to Marian University's Ancilla College. He championed the institution through his work, providing invaluable airtime to faculty and staff through insightful interviews and engaging commercials. His enthusiastic play-by-play announcing of men's and women's Chargers basketball games brought the excitement of the court to countless listeners, solidifying his role as a vital voice for the community.

Tony's commitment to excellence in broadcasting was recognized with the Indiana High School Athletic Association (IHSAA) Distinguished Media Service Award in 2006 and the Griddy Award for Excellence in Football Media in 2023. His academic achievements further underscored his dedication, earning an Associate of Business degree from Ancilla College and a Bachelor of Science in Communications degree from Purdue University.

Today, we honor Tony's memory and celebrate his contributions. Candidates for Degrees | 2025

Candidates in a baccalaureate program who have earned at least 60 credit hours of graded coursework at Marian University and who have achieved a grade point average of 3.50 or above are awarded Latin Honors as follows:

- cum laude grade point average of 3.50
- magna cum laude grade point average of 3.70
- summa cum laude grade point average of 3.80

In this program Latin Honors are based on March 18, 2025, academic status. Diplomas are awarded subject to satisfactory completion of requirements.

Phi Theta Kappa recognizes the academic achievement of students. Students who earn a 3.5 cumulative grade point average are invited to join Phi Theta Kappa. Members must maintain a 3.3 cumulative grade point average to remain active members. Candidates in the associate program are recognized as a member of Phi Theta Kappa by the golden stoles worn during commencement.
